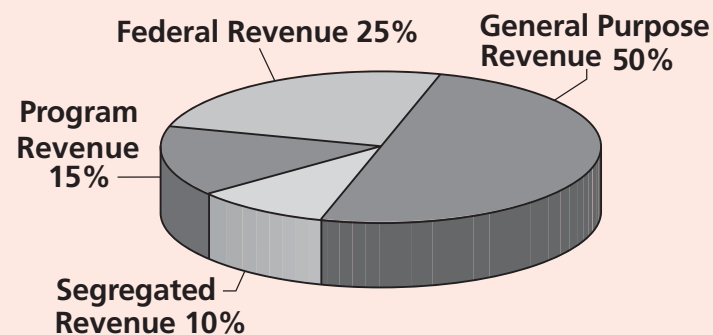

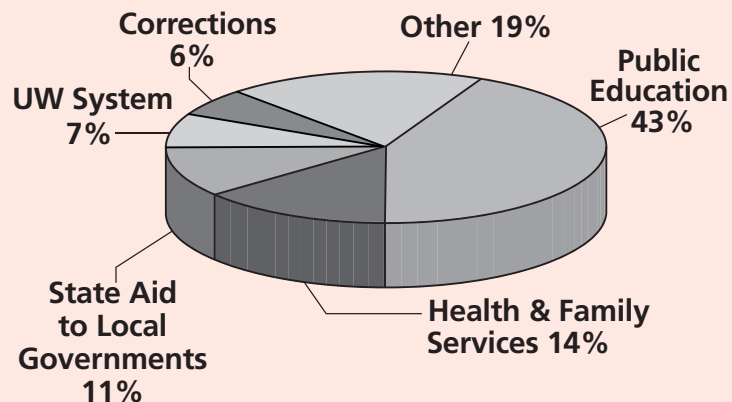

An Update on Highway 41 Expansion Project

Oconto to Peshtigo

As I met with local residents this past fall, one of the top issues of discussion was keeping the Highway 41 project on track.

This remains a top priority for me in seeing this project move forward as planned. At the time of writing this newsletter, we have just begun deliberations on the Governor's budget proposal. I will be working to make sure the Highway 41 project stays on track. I have brought my concerns to my colleagues who serve on the Joint Committee on Finance, the committee which will revise the Governor's

budget proposal before it is sent to both houses of the Legislature for a final vote.

I see this project not only as a safety issue, but also as an economic development opportunity for our area. I will continue to work with officials at the Department of Transportation to make sure the timeframe remains on schedule.
